The Eastbank Lake project in Shepparton is a catalyst project that aims to transform an underutilised anabranch of the Goulburn River into an environmentally sustainable urban waterfront precinct.

The design development, led by ex-Mayor of Shepparton Geoff Dobson, has involved the collaboration of key authorities and community members, including the Greater Shepparto City Council, Coulburn Valley Water, the Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority and local community initiative PlayerConnect, to devel a shared vision for the area.
